

A Reading from First Kings

The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Ephesians

Putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbors, for we are members of one another. Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun go down on your anger, and do not make room for the devil. Thieves must give up stealing; rather let them labor and work honestly with their own hands, so as to have something to share with the needy. Let no evil talk come out of your mouths, but only what is useful for building up, as there is need, so that your words may give grace to those who hear. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with which you were marked with a seal for the day of redemption. Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

For those confined to home or care center, for Julie, Ken, Fifi, Clarice, Jane, Virginia, and Wright; we pray for those people whose names were received online, for ______, are there others for whom we pray (*people may add their own petitions*). We humbly accept that Christ loved us and gave himself for us:

Give to us the living Bread of life, for whoever comes to Christ will hunger and thirst no more; and they shall all be taught of God:

Taste and see that the Lord is good; happy are they who trust in God!

The Celebrant adds a concluding Collect.

Almighty God, to whom our needs are known before we ask: Help us to ask only what accords with your will; and those good things which we dare not, or in our blindness cannot ask, grant us for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. **AMEN.**



ONLINE: THE PRAYER OF ST. ALPHONSUS DE LIGUORI (1696-1787)

A spiritual communion is a personal devotional that anyone can pray at any time to express their desire to receive Holy Communion at that moment, but in which circumstances impede them from actually receiving Communion.

My Jesus,

I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

I love you above all things, and long for you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.

As though you have already come,
I embrace you and unite myself entirely to you; never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.



IN-PERSON: HOLY COMMUNION IN ONE OR BOTH KINDS

At this time, an usher will come forward and invite each row to go forward for communion. **Bread.** When it is your turn to receive communion simply extend your cupped hands forward, and a priest will place the wafer of bread in your hands. **Gluten Free.** If you would prefer a gluten-free wafer, extend your hands palms down. **Real Wine.** If you wish to receive the wine, you may drink from the chalice or you may dip the wafer into the chalice. **Two Stations.** You may choose to receive communion at the altar rail or at the station on the right side in front of the pulpit.



You will have heard from the Bishop that the leadership of the Diocese is holding "listening sessions" across the Diocese in order to collect data to create a Strategic Five Year Plan. We are literally listening for where the Holy Spirit is moving in our congregations so that we can align ourselves with what God is already doing in our congregations. Like wind powering a windmill, our Five-Year Plan is to let the Spirit give us the power to do the work.

Join us for an eye-opening seminar on protecting yourself and your loved ones from common online threats and scams. Learn simple, practical



YOUTH CONVENTION 2024

August 24-25

Youth Convention is a weekend of fun, fellowship, and learning with youth from across the diocese. This year's theme is "Choose this day whom you will serve," and will center on Joshua's call to serve the Lord found in Joshua 24. Convention will be held at Camp WaJaTo, 1518 KS 14, in Lyons. The Youth Convention begins Saturday at noon and ends on Sunday at 2pm. It is open to all youth entering grades 5 through 12. During convention, two youth delegates will be chosen by the group.
